Last Weeks Key point: Those who crave God's righteousness will be filled to complete satisfaction, something the world promises but never fulfills.

Follow up and review last weeks discussion What was it about? What stood out? What Impact did it have on you, at work, with your family

What did you hear from or see from God this week?

Key Point: Point: We are obligated to be merciful, to have compassion on a person in unhappy circumstances. We are to actively desire to help remove those miseries. Just as it behooved Jesus to be merciful and free man from sin, a disciple of Jesus is obligated to be merciful to those he comes into contact with as we too have been given the ministry of reconciliation, as heirs, servants and representatives of Jesus. As representatives of Jesus, God himself, chosen by God to represent Him, as Jesus was, we are called, appointed, to make gifts and sacrifices for the sin of men.

Read Matthew 5:7 *Blessed are the merciful for they shall obtain mercy.* -5:7 ESV

What is your definition of MERCY?

Share; a story of how someone showed you mercy?-

<u>Merciful</u> [1655] **eleemon** = not merely those who express acts of mercifulness, but who have this attribute as a result of the indwelling God; blessed because of Christ

Comparison of Hebrews 2:17 translations

- "Therefore he <u>had to be made</u> like his brothers in every respect, so that he might become a merciful and faithful high priest in the service of God, to make propitiation for the sins of the people."
- KJV "Wherefore in all things it <u>behooved</u> him to be made like unto his brethren, that a merciful and faithful high priest in things pertaining to God, to make reconciliation for the sins of the people."

Discuss the implications of the translations.

<u>Behooved</u> [3784] opheilo = to owe, to be indebted; metaphorically, to be bound or obligated to perform a duty, meaning I ought, must, followed by the inf.; of what the circumstances of time, place, or person render proper, to be fit and proper (<u>Heb 2:17</u>)

Read Hebrews 5:1-3: **Discuss** the overall ramifications to us and in our daily life of this passage.

Do I offer gifts and sacrifices for the sins of the people? Do I offer myself? The gift is my sacrifice.

Read -Heb. 11:4 ESV

When we give mercy to others, we offer to God our gift of sacrifice, in faith, and are commended as righteous; just as Abel, Abraham, Jesus, Job were commended and credited with righteousness.

Discuss: Do I see mercy as an issue of faith?

Not giving someone what they deserve, and instead giving them what they don't deserve is an acceptable, encouraged, obligated sacrifice with Christ.

Reconciliation [2433] hilaskomai = to be kind, gentle, gracious, merciful.

- Jesus in sacrificing Himself for our sins showed Him to be merciful and faithful. His sacrifice satisfied God's justice so that, instead of God rightly demonstrating His wrath toward sinful men, He demonstrated His mercy.
- Jesus offers Himself as both victim and priest, thus satisfying the
 justice of God and at the same time procuring forgiveness for sins
 whereby man is reconciled and offered access to and communion with
 God
- Jesus therefore, makes possible the taking away of sins of man without violating God's holiness.
- Therefore, it is the nature of man that is changed before God in Christ;
 God's nature is not changed from hatred to love, He has always and
 will always be Love.

"Much more then, having now been justified by His blood, we shall be saved from the wrath of God through Him." -Romans 5:9 ESV

Think back to the occasion when you were shown mercy, how did that affect your life?

Do you show mercy?

Going back to Hebrews 2:17 is there something the Holy Spirit is revealing to you that you need to deal with? If we are walking the path that the Holy Spirit is guiding on then to be HIS; we are opheilo, behooved, to show mercy. There are no if's or but's.

Take a quiet moment and ask the Holy Spirit to help you begin the process for you to give mercy.
